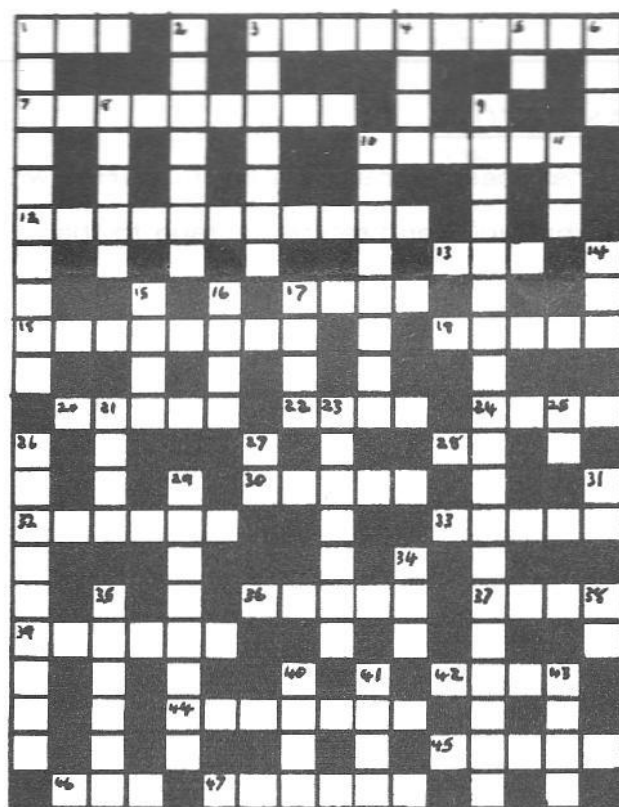

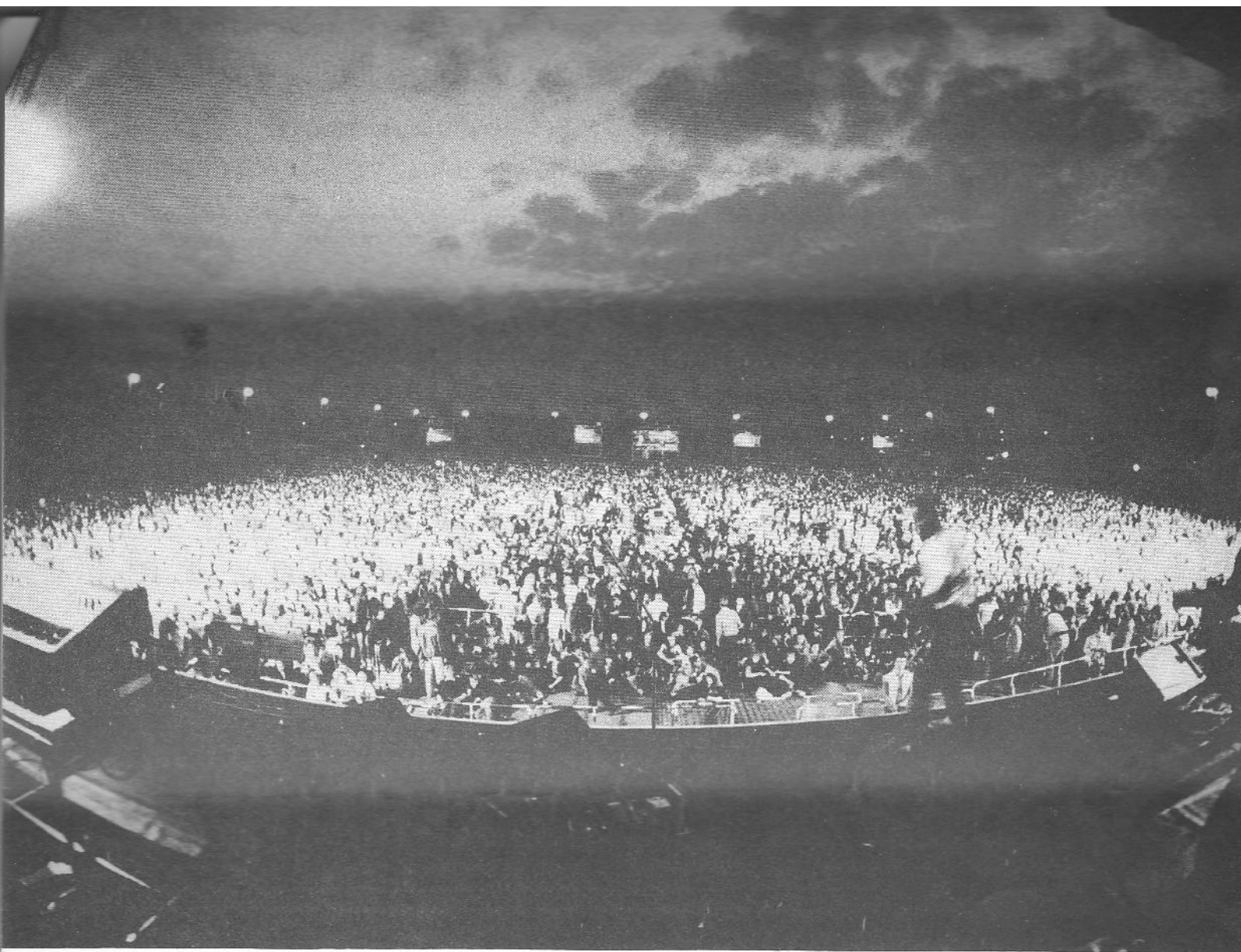

BJH - A CONCERT FOR THE PEOPLE BERLIN, SAT 30 AUG 1980

Saturday 30 August saw a special event in the city of Berlin when BJH gave a free concert for the people of Germany. At dusk John Les and Mel made their way to the specially built stage on the steps of the Reichstagsgelände, which stands beside the Wall that divides West and East Berlin. The concert that followed was a newly created 2 hour show for the thousands of people (175,000 actually was the official police count) who packed the beautiful lawns in front of the imposing and historic building. Appropriately it featured many of the classic BJH songs from the past 14 years, together with some brand new material. This was the first time that a major international rock group ever gave a free concert in Germany and particularly in Berlin, to whom Les dedicated his haunting tribute - Berlin - one of the songs on XII.

John Les and Mel decided to create this opportunity to express their gratitude and thanks to all their fans in Germany who have given them, over the past few years, a level of success which very few bands in the world today could hope to match.

This unique and memorable Festival commenced around 4pm that day with a series of theatrical events and entertainments, staged on the lawns surrounding the Reichstagsgelände. These events were organised for BJH by the Cultural Committee of the Berlin Senate.

There is little doubt that this emotion packed concert beside the Berlin Wall was one of the most memorable highlights in the long and distinguished 14 year career of BJH.

Unfortunately for me, I was on holiday, thought no-one knew it. Otherwise I could have gone to the concert. Apparently people spent most of the day before trying to get hold of me. Just my luck!

Sept 12 found BJH in the studios recording their new single - IN MEMORY OF THE MARTYRS and LIFE IS FOR LIVING. I have no release date for this at present.

November and December will see BJH recording their next studio album - again no further details except it's hoped to release it in February 1981.

There is also the possibility of a live album and film of Berlin in the New Year.

Still on Berlin brings me to the announcement of the prizes for the competition. I am awarding 4 first prizes and 4 second prizes. The first prizes will be a special Berlin - Concert for the People t-shirt and the second prizes a badge on the same theme.

That's it for now. See you in December.
