BARCLAY JAMES returned to Manchester last Friday to again confirm that something decent can come out of Oldham.

After a short delay they made a dramatic entrance and the first number was enough to show that the sound problems which bugged the last Manchester concerts had been ironed out.

After running through some numbers from the new album the band soon had the audience in the palm of their hands when the naunting songs that are their hallmark were performed

The finale was well planned with Poor Man's Moody Blues bringing the house and the curtain down.

The encore was inevitable and several songs came from that with the audience rising at the feet of the band.
