As the more observant ones amongst you will have already noticed our post code is now **SK2 6RG** so please use this in future.

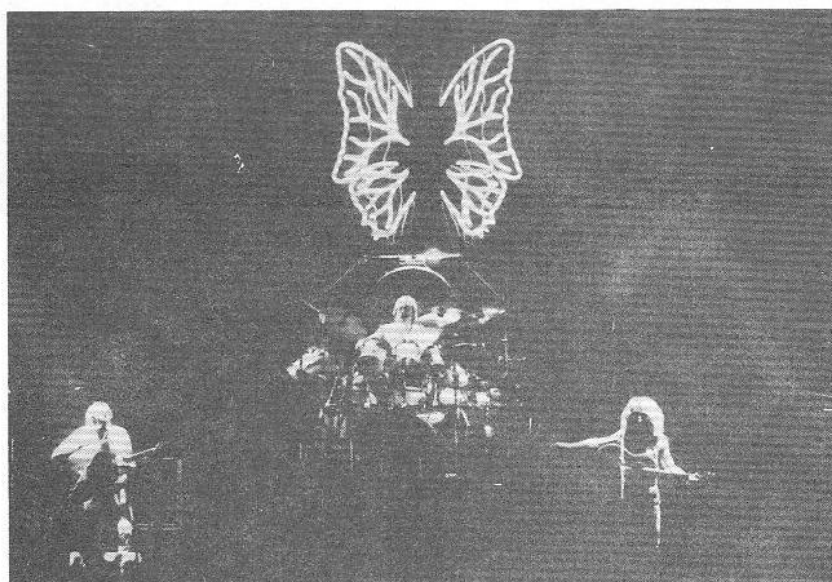
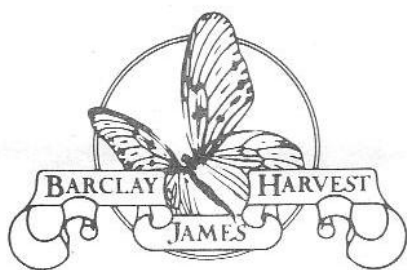
JOHN's QUESTIONS

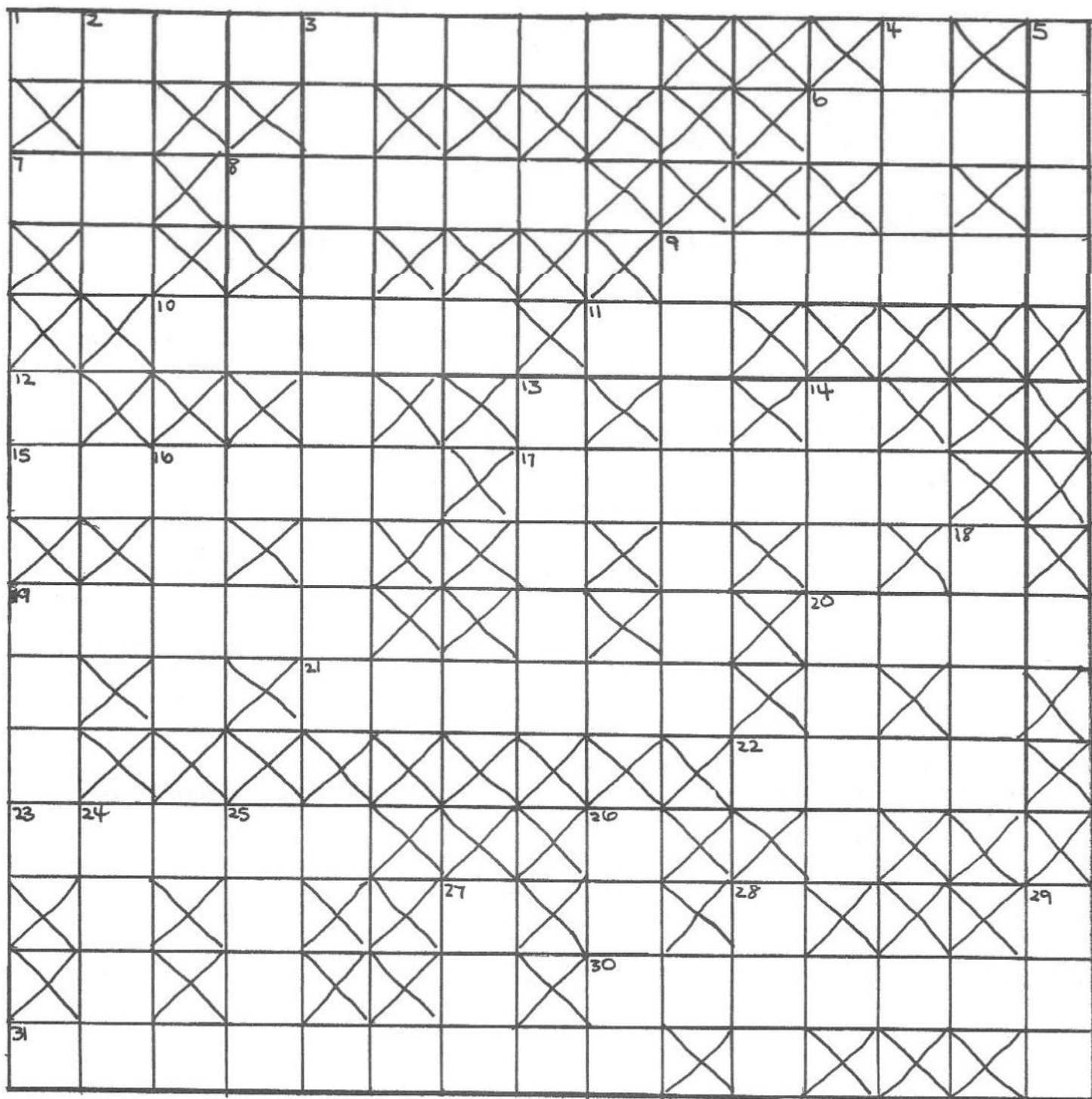
