To jog your memories, the prize offered was an expenses paid trip to Frankfurt to spend a day in the studios with BJH. Added to this the winners will have preview of the new album tracks followed by dinner with the boys. What a superb prize!!

## A PARIS AVEC LES BARCLEEES!!!

Two of the FOBJH's who joined us on the trip to Paris have written their experiences down for you to share - those of you who were with us will no doubt enjoy reading about it too. Over to:-

#### Steve Heap ...

Out of this world, excellent, brilliant - those were the words I used to describe the concert given by the lads in Frankfurt earlier this year. Well the same can be said again after seeing the lads in Paris - do they ever do a bad gig? They really played an excellent show and also debuted a new light show.

After having a great three days in Paris the actual gig was the icing on the cake. The band opened with ROCK 'N' ROLL LADY and it took a few more numbers for things to start getting warmed up. Once the crowd reacted the gig was fantastic.

A lot of the set contained songs from the last 2 albums EYES OF THE UNIVERSE and TURN OF THE TIDE. These being the new 'standars' - LOVE ON THE LINE, PLAY TO THE WORLD, LIFE IS FOR LIVING and IN MEMORY OF THE MARTYRS. The band went on to play some of the great 'old standards' like CHILD OF THE UNIVERSE MOCKINGBIRD and CRAZY CITY.

The last song of the evening was, of course, the one and only **HYMN** which was probably the best I have ever seen it played with the crowd going bananas. John really let himself go on this and looked tobe really enjoying himself.

Overall the lads played as well as ever. Also a mention for Kevin and Colin who also played very well. These two have become important members of the band and deserve more credit than they get.

Finally the new light show is similar to the one seen on the last British tour except the moving portcullis is now is one piece and also the lights around move hydraulically. Very effective. Lastly, no BJH gig would be complete without the neon butterfly.

## And from Robert Ironmonger ...

It's just about time to start falling from cloud nine, back to ground level. Despite any small problems that were encountered on the Paris trip, Lynn and I thoroughly enjoyed ourselves. A potted history oc the trip is as follows:-

Around midnight as promised by Mead Gould the coach left Gloucester Road coach station. On reaching Dover we found that our ferry was in fact scheduled to sail at 6.00am and not 4.00 which meant another hour long wait at this port. The outward crossing was choppy enough to make one or two people feel rough (especially after eating breakfast).

After a couple more overland stops we finally hit Paris at about 2pm and checked into our hotels.

Sunday afternoon and evening and Monday morning we were free to sight see until 5pm when the coach collected us to take us to the Hippodrome. It wasn't too far to the gig but the traffic in Paris was so heavy that it took almost 2 hours. Chrissie went to get the tickets and returned emptyhanded!! Apparently the person who had our tickets had gone on her tea break. At 7.30 Chrissie went back for the tickets and after what appeared ages returned with the valuables.

Eventually the concert started and the French crowd, like the Germans, warmed to the Band from the word go. The gig finished too quickly, the crowd were screaming for more. The roadies came on and appeared

to be dismantling things. Horror! No encore!! No, the lads came back and pleased us with two more songs and then retired again. Still the crowd wanted more. All waiting for **HYMN**. At long last they came back and performed the sacred song.

The lights came up on another show, the crowds were going and people ceased to shout for 'more'. And for us it was back into the coach for the trip home.

Even the rough return crossing couldn't dampen my or my wife's enthusiasms. We arrived back at Gloucester Road around 9.00am (I think) by this time my lack of sleep was catching up.

I would like to take this opportunity to pass on my thanks to you Chrissie for making the trip more memorable (getting the jacket signed).

## And now I'll tell you what it felt like to be official courier!!!

It was a horrifying prospect when Martin Mead handed me the folder containing the details of the trip and as he headed for home I headed for a nervous breakdown!!! Joe (the driver - to whom I shall be eternally grateful - for his patience and help) and I attempted to do a head count prior to setting off and some clever clows (not, I hasten to add FOBJH's) were determined to confuse us. Eventually we set off and I went round and had a chat with most FOBJH's.

During the time in Paris my husband and I (sound like a certain royal lady there) spent a lovely day sightseeing with Steve Heap, Martin Taylor, and Mark and Keith Holroyd (yes from the same family) but don't ask me how I survived a trip up the Eiffel Tower - ask them. Rats!!!

I thoroughly enjoyed the concert. Apart from watching the boys, I get a great deal of enjoyment from studying the audience and their delightful reactions. I even spotted an Old English Sheepdog enjoying himself!! I must admit I was a little disappointed when the boys retired from the stage prior to returning to sing **HYMN**. Can you believe I was pining for the neon butterfly??? I just could not believe that it wouldn't be there and refused to leave my seat. My patience was rewarded though.

Backstage, things were chaotic. It was very windy and the Hippodrome is not a theatre but a huge big top. Apparently during the afternoon the roof had blown completely off. Then to add to the problems, the stage had partially collapsed and even at the last minute the boys were having problems with the feedback. To add to that there was a veritable crowd of press people waiting to interview them and I was busily trying to get everything sent backstage autographed!!!

However, as they say, all's well that ends well and it certainly did.

The next time Mead Gould run a trip of this nature, I really recommend as many as possible of you to try and come along. The atmosphere on the coach after the concert was worth the trip. So many tired, happy people. It was fantastic.


